ADMINISTRATIVE MEMORANDUM

GRADE POINT AVERAGE AND CLASS RANK/HONOR ROLL (GRADES 6-12) | 7011.2

The District encourages students to strive for academic excellence. To that end, we recognize students who have achieved specific academic standards.

The grade point average (GPA) in the District is a weighted average and is computed by using only the grades in the academic core courses of English, Social Studies, Mathematics, Science, Foreign Language, and any Advanced Placement (AP) course. A grade of C or better in an AP level course receives an additional one and one-half (1.5) quality points in the computation of the GPA. A grade of C or better in an honors level course receives an additional one (1.0) quality point in the computation of the GPA. The weighted cumulative GPA is used to determine class rank.

To determine eligibility for honor roll status, an un-weighted GPA, which includes all grades of A, B, C, D, or F in the five academic core courses as identified above, is used. Students who receive a grade of D, I, U, or F in non-core content areas are not eligible for the honor roll. A GPA of 4.0 = Distinguished Honors; a GPA of 3.0–3.9 = Honors.
