Delaware Library Catalog Mobile App

Here is an app that came out in January 2012 that provides access to the Delaware Public Library system and a fair selection of eBooks that can be delivered immediately to your iPad.

The Delaware Library Catalog (DLC) app allows you to download e-books to the iPad. Books must be available in the Delaware Public Library system. You must have the following prerequisites to download e-books to your iPad:

- A Library card number and PIN number
- OverDrive Media Console app (see below)
- Registered Adobe user (see below)

Follow these steps to download your first eBook:

1. After downloading the DLC app, go to “Downloadables” to search for eBooks and eAudioBooks
2. Type in a book you are searching for or look at what’s available. At the time of this writing, over 2900 eDownloads were immediately available. Many children’s books are included, such as the Berenstain Bears series, Richard Scarry, Thomas the Train, and Golden Books.
3. Your search will tell you what books are available for immediate download.
4. The first time you download an eBook, you will be prompted to download OverDrive Media Console. This is a free app that will allow you to download digital books.
5. Next, you will be prompted to set up an Adobe account. I used my Red Clay e-mail address and password to do this.
6. The book will now be downloaded to your iPad and you will have the eBook for 3 weeks. All your downloaded eBooks will be available to see in the “My Account” section. Items that are due will be highlighted in red. There is also a number next to each book that you download that shows how many more days the book will be available to you without a late fee.
7. You will be able to control several features on the book including:
 - Brightness of the page
 - Font type and size (only 2 sizes to choose from)
 - Black, white, or sepia background (black background has white text, sepia has black text)
 - Text alignment and Line spacing
8. The eBooks will not read out loud to the student. They are just books available in digital format. Because of this, however, you could use the Voice Over function found under “Settings” and “Accessibility” on your iPad. Be careful when activating this feature...it changes the way you select and scroll.
